CHRIS'S COMMENTS

The Community informational meeting hosted by Many Mayor Freeman was very well attended filling the Community Center. Information regarding the possible closure and reconveyance of Hodges Gardens to the Hodges Foundation was provided the crowd.

I urged the State to fulfill its contractual and legal obligation to sufficiently fund the park in order to continuously operate it as Hodges Gardens State Park emphasizing the power of Lt. Governor Nunguesser to fund the park whatever his budget and that he should due to its unique status within the State Park system.

Linda Curtis Sparks, Marci Cook, and Stacy Brown representing the tourist commissions from Sabine, Vernon, and Caddo-Bossier Parishes respectively provided data of the local and regional economic impact of the park. Office of State Parks director, Robert Barham stated the Hodges Foundation had delivered a letter asserting the state was in default of the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement (CEA) and had 60 days to "cure" the default.

Senator Long, and Representatives Armes and Howard indicated support for the park. District Attorney Don Burkett stated that he had read the CEA and the State was not in default and would not be until July 1st and only then if the park was not funded. He asked why the State had been so quick to 1) shut down cabin reservations after March 31st, 2) discuss movement of staff to other parks, and 3) plan for the removal of state property from the park site if closure had not already been determined. Mr. Barham failed to provide answers.

Don Weinell of the Baton Rouge Astronomical Society, which holds an annual Star Party at Hodges, pointed out that no other park in the state provides the experience that Hodges does. Other parks in the system have similar amenities and facilities to one another thereby providing similar experiences unlike Hodges Gardens.

I urged the crowd to continue to contact the Lt. Governor and legislators to fund the park. Thanks to Chase Baker of Broken Stone Productions, you may view the entire meeting as he live streamed it on Facebook. If you would like to view the meeting Like his page and click on videos.

Please continue contacting your legislators and the administration as requested previously especially during the budget discussions. We will continue our fight to stay open as Hodges Gardens State Park.

Park Hours of Operation:

The gates open at 8AM daily and close at 9PM Sunday through Thursday and 10PM on Friday and Saturday. The Gardens close at sunset. Admission is \$7 per person, seniors 62+ and children under 3 are admitted free. Annual passes are available for \$80 and admit the cardholder and any passengers in the vehicle. There are 13 cabins and a group camp, and 9 unimproved tent campsites and a primitive camping area. Also there are boats with paddles and life jackets available for rent.
