#### THE OLD FASHIONED ROSE GARDEN

Maintained by volunteers through funding provided by Friends of Hodges Gardens

When Mr. Hodges created this particular garden in the late 1950's, he selected the finest antique roses of the time. Roses were his passion and he filled this area with old garden climbers, polyanthas, teas and chinas. He also wanted the same architectural style to be reflected throughout the Gardens. The same angles and shapes can be seen here in the Old Fashioned Garden, at the Lookout Tower, Visitor Center and Circle Bed. Mr. Hodges chose redwood for the arbors and pavilions, along with the same sand-stone found throughout the Gardens.

The Office of State Parks replaced the redwood with treated pine in 2008, taking great care to protect the climbers, espe-



cially the grand Lady Banks on either side of the west pavilion. These two Ladies were among the first roses planted by Mr. Hodges in this garden, and still put on a brilliant display each year in early-mid spring. The almost invisible fencing was installed around the arbor to protect the roses from the deer that also love them.

We all know that change is inevitable and the changes that took place through the years took its toll on this particular garden. Of all the niche gardens within Hodges Gardens, the Old Fashioned requires a great deal of time and attention as well as passion for the care of the roses. Changes in ownership and caregivers since the 1950s left it in need of revival and renovation. It was adopted in 2015 by the Friends of Hodges Gardens and the revival began. A grant from the Volunteer Generation Fund gave the Old Fashioned the much needed public awareness, attention and initial funds to get started.

Today, the Old Fashioned Garden stands as a memorial and tribute to Mr. Hodges and his vision. It contains 175+ roses that were introduced prior to 1966, the year of Mr. Hodges death. Appreciation is given to The Antique Rose Emporium in Brenham, Texas as they assist in the selection process. Volunteers are now the key to this garden's success. Every Tuesday and Thursday morning they can be found pruning, weeding, deadheading and fertilizing. 


#### **GIFT SHOP EVOLUTION**

Admission is \$5 per person, \$4 for seniors 62+ and children under 3 are admitted free. Annual passes are available for \$80 and admit the cardholder and any passengers in the vehicle. There are 13 cabins and a group camp, and 9 unimproved tent campsites and a primitive camping area. Also there are boats with paddles and life jackets available for rent.
